What is b-side festival like?



The festival takes place at various sites across the whole of Isle of Portland



In some venues there may be crowds.



b-side is a multimedia arts festival, so there are lots of different events to see – including exhibitions, films, sculptures, and more.



A lot of families go to b-side festival.



There may be some bright or flashing lights in some events.



There may be some loud noises.



Some of the festival is outside, so prepare for bad weather. Portland can be windy.



There may be hot weather, so prepare with sunscreen, a sun hat, and a water bottle.



If you need help, you can ask one of our festival stewards. They'll be wearing bright coloured b-side t-shirts.



Toilets and disabled toilets are marked on the b-side map.



There might be some uneven ground in places.



Portland is bigger than you may think. It can be tiring to get around to all of the artworks.



COVID-19: If you would like to use them, face masks and hand sanitisers will be at the festival hub and other indoor venues.



The artworks have been installed in places across the island, you can access these places by walking, wheeling, cycling, going on a public bus, driving.
